Qualifications

- Satisfy all Financial Services and Human Capital obligations for employment
- Maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress and a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA
- Have a grade of a "B" or better in the subject content being tutored
- Have a recommendation letter from a Rasmussen College faculty member
- Possess good oral and written communication skills and ease in relating to people from varying educational, cultural, and social backgrounds.

- Enrollment in the Tutor Excellence Course
 - 4 module online course (asynchronous)
 - Basic tutoring guidelines
 - Setting goals and effective session techniques
 - Integrating study skills and digital fluency
 - Modeling problem-solving and fostering independent learners
- Webinars (synchronous)
 - Standard lesson plans
 - Offered by Learning Services Coordinators
 - 4 mandatory topics (3.5 hours)
 - "Optional" topics vary each quarter (2.5)




Figure 3: Image showing a tutor evaluation.
