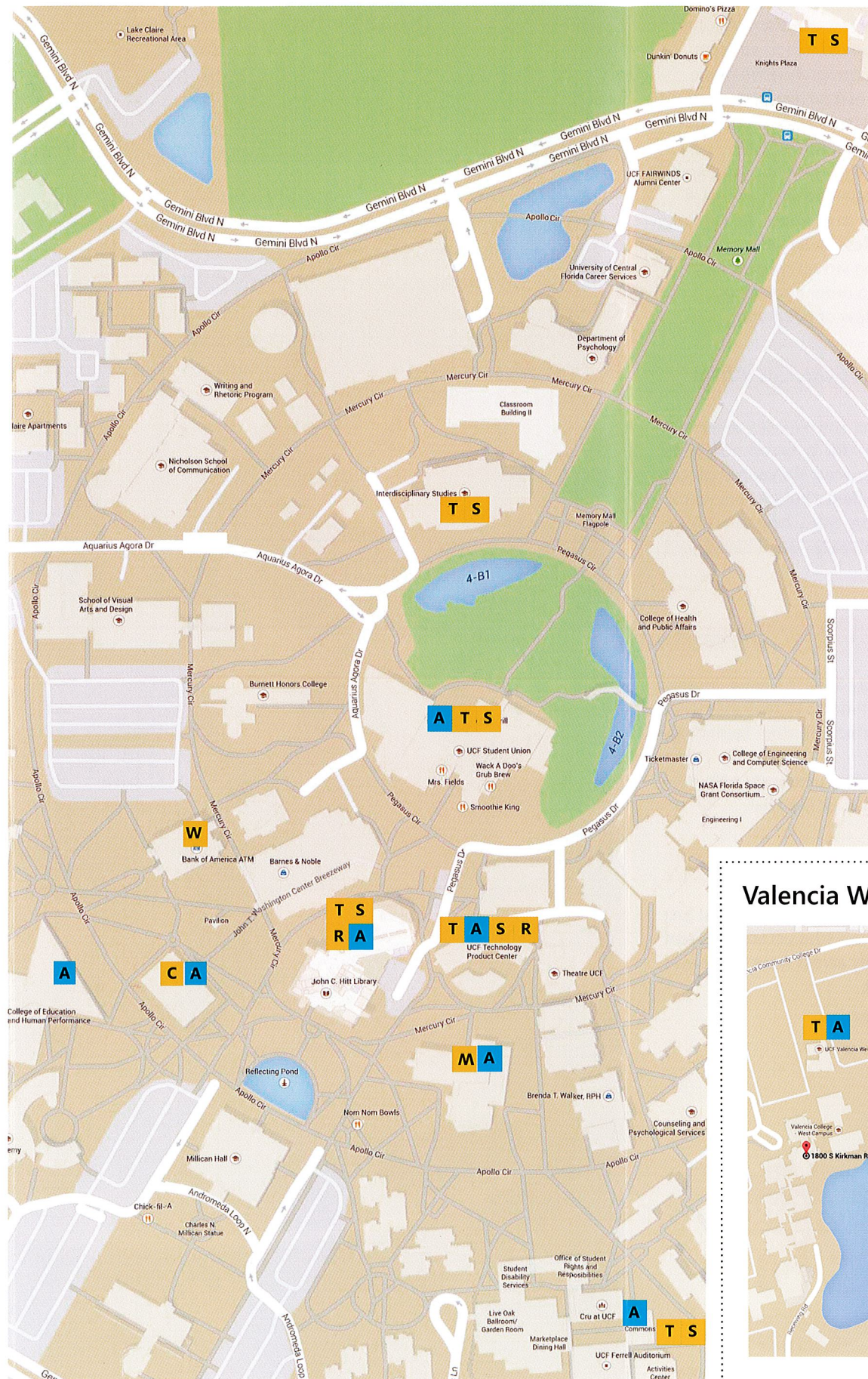

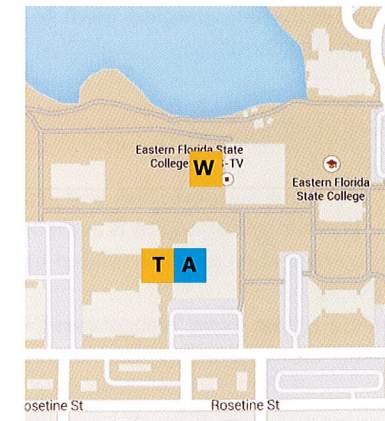

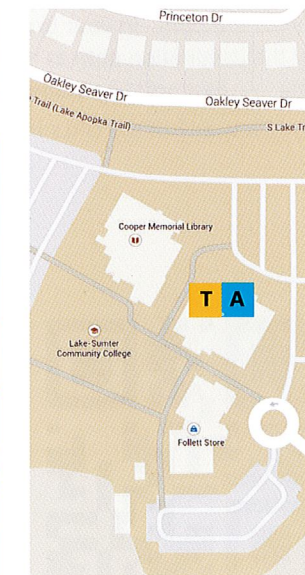

Study Space**/study**

UCF provides a number of different areas on campus to find a space for quiet study or to meet classmates and study collaboratively. Available areas include All Knight Study @ Ferrell Commons, All Knight Study @ Knight's Plaza, SGA Computer Lab, SGA Express Print Lab, John C. Hitt Library, and Technology Commons.

Additionally, in the John C. Hitt Library, students can use computers, find group & individual study spaces, reserve study rooms and a presentation practice room, and check out many mobile devices from the LibTECH Desk.

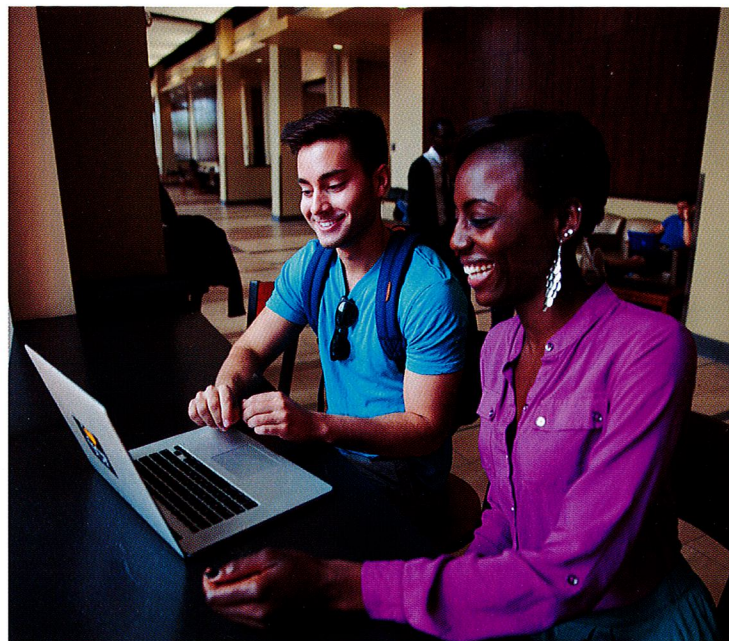
Technology Commons provides large computer labs, laptop and tablet checkout, and group study spaces in Technology Commons I, II, and Classroom 1 101. Technology Commons also includes the Student Support Desk and the Technology Service Center to provide students support if they experience an issue with a PC or other devices.

Learning Online @ UCF**/online**

Did you know that more than 75% of UCF students take at least one online (W) or mixed-mode (M) course every year? Many online resources are available to support students in succeeding with online learning. Students can utilize these resources to find UCF classes that require few or no face-to-face class meetings, success strategies for learning online, and tutorials to assist with navigating the Webcourses@UCF online learning platform. Students can also obtain technical help for classes using Webcourses@UCF, Panopto, Obojobo, Materia, or UCF video. Free Printing**/print**

Students receive 100 free pages of printing per week at All Knight Study, All Knight Study II, SGA Computer Lab, and SGA Express Print Lab.

**Regional Campus Support****/regional**

Regional Campuses extend the academic support and student development efforts of the Main UCF Orlando campus to those students who attend classes or live near one of UCF's ten regional campus locations. At each site, students have access to advisors and student services teams who provide a comprehensive range of support services, including transfer orientation, career services, experiential learning, veteran services, transition assistance, and accommodations for students with disabilities. Additionally, professional advisors provide guidance on the academic programs that are hosted online or are located at respective sites, as well as offer career and academic support in order to promote the success of the students on their campuses. All professional staff members are equipped with innovative tools, offering virtual appointments and other online or virtual programming in order to making meeting with students convenient, regardless of geographic limitations.

Student Development and Enrollment Services (SDES)

SDES is comprised of dozens of programs and services dedicated to providing students with opportunities for a broad collegiate experience. From Admissions to Career Services, the various offices incorporated into SDES connect with students before they enroll in courses all the way through graduation. Technical Support**/support**

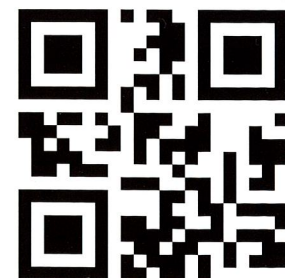
The Student Support Desk and Technology Service Center, located in Technology Commons, is available for students to seek assistance with any technical issues related to PCs, Macs, or other technology devices.

Student Academic Resource Center**/sarc**

SARC provides academic support services to help students develop college-level study skills and be successful academically. Services are available to UCF students and include group-based peer tutoring, Supplemental Instruction (SI), academic success workshops, learning skills consultations, and 24-hour review sessions during final exam week through the Study Union in Spring and Fall.

SARC hosts additional tutoring sessions at the Veterans Academic Resource Center - open to all UCF students, as well as in the College of Engineering Computer Science, where tutoring is provided specifically for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math courses.

Math Tutoring**/math**

The Math Lab is a friendly place to learn mathematics. Free drop-in tutoring for students enrolled in undergraduate mathematics courses taught by the Department of Mathematics at UCF is available in the Math Lab.

Writing Support**/writing**

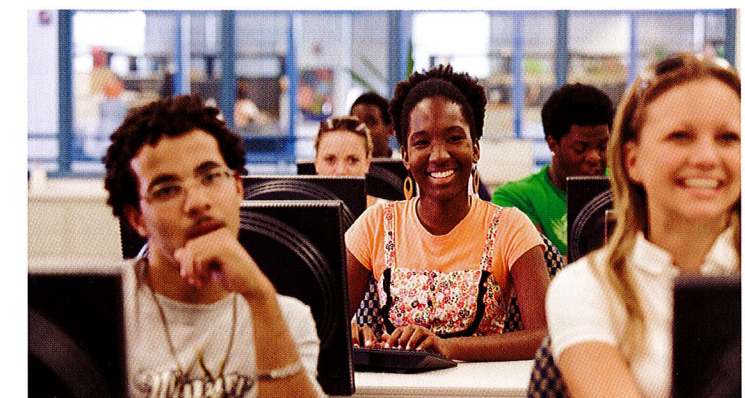
